

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?



Eligibility

You must be currently enrolled in a government-based assistance program or have a household income less than 200% of federal poverty guidelines (see chart below) or 60% of area median income.

Qualifying Income-Based Assistance Programs

- Adult & Child Mental Health Case Management
- Employment Services (only if income-based in your state)
- Extended Foster Care
- Food Support (e.g. WIC, SNAP) (a dated letter showing current eligibility is required)
- Financial Assistance, such as GA, TANF, etc. (a dated letter showing current eligibility is required)
- Head Start
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- Medicaid or Medical Assistance (bring a document that says "MA" or "Medical Assistance" on it)
- The National School Lunch Program's Free or Reduced Lunch Program
- Section 8, Federal Public Housing Assistance, or Group Residential Housing (GRH)
- Section 42, Low Income Housing Tax Credit unit or other HUD low income program
- Social Security Disability (SSD)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Pell Grant
