#### A NOTE FROM UNITED WAY LEADERSHIP

As we reflect on the past year, we are immensely proud of the strides made at United Way of the Greater Chippewa Valley (UWGCV) in 2022-2023. The dedication and hard work of our staff, board of directors, advisory councils, committee members and volunteers have been instrumental in driving our impact and maintaining our relevance in the Chippewa Valley. We are excited to share key accomplishments from the past year and offer a glimpse into our plans for the coming year.

#### Accomplishments:

- Successful First Year of 2022-2025 Grant Cycle: We completed the first year of the current grant cycle. This included a
  review of Annual Progress Reports (APR) by staff, Advisory Council and Board members. The review process ensures
  that we are all working toward the same goals to best utilize the invested funds. Through our collaboration with our 22
  Program Partners, we will continue to positively impact the Chippewa Valley through our funded programs.
- Child Care Task Force/Dream Up! Grant: The Child Care Task Force and UWGCV staff continued strategic planning on
  the Dream Up! Grant. Community listening sessions were hosted to learn more about child care needs in rural
  communities. University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire (UWEC) students researched to learn more about child care provider
  and worker satisfaction. Six individuals were assisted with tuition at Chippewa Valley Technical College (CVTC) to
  become certified in-home child care providers. Together we developed the Chippewa Valley Village, a monthly child care
  provider networking opportunity.
- Digital Equity & Inclusion Program: With almost one year completed, our Digital Equity & Inclusion pillar has established
  innovative ways to provide access to digital resources, such as affordable internet, devices, digital skills training and
  technical support in the Chippewa Valley. This is a fully grant-funded program that supports essential needs in our
  communities. Our goal is to establish this initiative as a campaign-funded program, which we can accomplish with your
  continued support.
- Maternal Child Health Grant: Eau Claire City-County Health Department received this grant and is collaborating with UWGCV and other key area partners. The goal of this grant is to develop a comprehensive understanding of local data related to child health outcomes, identify inequities and assess gaps in data. Over the course of the year, an extensive data review was completed to prepare for the development of a pilot program that will be implemented in 2024.

#### A Look Ahead:

- Child Care Task Force/Dream Up! Grant: Our Dream Up! grant team will continue to implement and finalize a plan to
  expand child care availability in rural Chippewa and Eau Claire counties. We will use the information learned from the
  work completed through the grant to expand resources and support through the work of the task force to make lasting
  change.
- Digital Equity & Inclusion Program Expansion: The Digital Equity & Inclusion Program will continue to provide increased support to low-income individuals, ensuring access to affordable high-speed internet, reliable devices, technology training and technical support resources. A digital navigator will be added with additional grant funds received to assist with trainings and technical support.
- Maternal Child Health Grant: United Way will continue to be actively involved in the planning and implementation of a pilot program for this grant which will occur in early 2024.

We owe these achievements to our generous donors. Your support, both in time and finances, has been instrumental in making all things possible. As leaders in building a stronger Chippewa Valley, your dedication has reduced duplication in services and allowed us to achieve far more collectively than any one of us could alone. We express our heartfelt gratitude for your continued commitment to Live United!
